Érika remembers that she started working at CMT when she was 17 years old, in the health department, where she worked for 21 years next to the founder, Catalina Mendoza who invited her to have lunch together on her first day of activities.

"She seriously looked at me and she told me: 'Remember that here we have a specific time to start our activities, but we do not have a specific time for having lunch or finishing our activities, because the priority and the most important thing is the attention to our patients. In case you do not want to stay here, the door is big enough to come in, but also to leave this place. I need people with passion and commitment to perform their activities and functions'", she related.

When she listened to those words, she understood that the only thing to do was learning and understanding that the service to people was the most important thing in the area of health, and that even yourself have to move to a second position.

"Now, I was given the chance of taking care of the president's chair because we all, the whole Congregación Mariana Trinitaria family, know that our founder will be our president forever. This is the moment when we understand that all the positions are not permanent, and that it is our responsibility to leave a mark and build a legacy" she explained.

She is proud to say she had such a big teacher as Doctor Catalina, who taught her that commitment, love, passion, and honesty must be achieved in other people first, and after that you can achieve it for yourself in order to develop your job successfully. That was the thing that impressed her tremendously, so she tries to teach that to her colleagues.
