

## Inequality indexes increase: UN

The Welfare Ecosystem CMT has a direct impact on social and economic development

The UN established the 17 sustainable development goals with the objective of improving the quality of life of people, protecting the environment, and reducing inequality indexes.

Maintaining international peace and security, taking efficient collective measures to prevent and eradicate threats, avoiding acts of aggression and other violations; are just some of the United Nations objectives. Last October 24, this world organization celebrated the 75th anniversary of the entry into force of the United Nations Charter, a founding document of this organization..

In this document you can find the purposes and principles of the UN, as well as the procedures to find pacific solutions in case of controversies. The UN was founded with the conviction that all nations cooperate to peacefully solve conflicts to improve the life of people.

For that reason, the UN established the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which constitute a universal call to end poverty, protect the planet, and improve the quality of life of people around the world.

**DATA** In 2015, all the United Nations Member States decided that the 17 objectives become part of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, which sets the framework to reach those objectives in 15 years' time

Due to the current situation in the world, the UN expects that inequalities will increase because of the global economic slowdown. It may become a risk for the development of the national sustainable development programs, and undoubtedly it will become a challenge for every government the rest of this year, and also during 2021.

Congregación Mariana Trinitaria (CMT) has developed for 23 years different actions that are aligned to the UN objectives. Its current model called Welfare Ecosystem CMT -also aligned to the SDGs- provides different benefits for families that need assistance, with the purpose of improving their quality of life and their basic necessities.

### CMT joins the fight against poverty, inequality and injustice; but also, against climate change

The Welfare Ecosystem enhances public policies and financial resources to benefit people. As a result of that, more than 90 programs and actions were developed to end poverty, and also to fight inequality and injustice.

The qualities of this model encouraged collaborations with several government areas in many cities all along the country, and also with organizations and civil societies. All those collaborations were developed to help people in vulnerable situations.

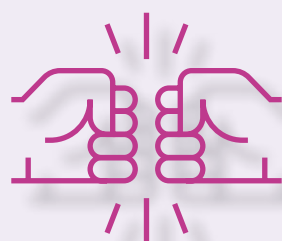
An example of that, is the agreement with Secretaría del Migrante in Michoacán, whose objective is to boost development on migrant families with actions like housing improvement, food programs, storage and optimal water consumption; among others that are planned as needs are detected
